Objective

The Softball Ontario Community Fun Team Leader is to:

- a. Represent Softball Ontario at Community Events as requested by the House League Services Committee and Program Coordinator
- b. Promote Softball Ontario Programs and Services to Communities
- c. Support House Leagues in promoting themselves at Community Events as requested by the House League Services Committee and Program Coordinator

Qualifications

- Must have a working knowledge of the game of softball
- Strong interpersonal and organizational skills
- Must have a Valid Drivers License and Access to a Vehicle
- Recommend that the Team Leader has attended at least one (1) Community Event as a Community Fun Team Volunteer
- Must be able to show leadership as well as follow direction

Responsibilities

General

- Adhere to all Softball Ontario Policies & Procedures
- Complete & Sign Softball Ontario's Volunteer Application Form and Confidentiality Agreement

Community Fun Team

- Actively seek Community Events within the Region and make recommendations for participation to Softball Ontario
- Lead and Supervise the Community Fun Team during Community Events as requested by the House League Services Committee and Program Coordinator
- To recommend candidates for the region's Softball Ontario Community Fun Team
- Care for and Maintain Softball Ontario Property and Materials used for Community Events
- To assign members of the region's Community Fun Team to Community Events as requested by Softball Ontario

Commitment/Duration of the Job

- The position of a Community Fun Team Leader covers a two (2) year term ending September 1.

Supervisor

- The Community Fun Team Leader is responsible to the Regional Coordinator, the Chairperson of the House League Services Committee and the Program Coordinator.

Orientation / Training

- a. Must Mentor at a Minimum of one (1) Event with a Member of the House League Services Committee or the Program Coordinator
- b. Must be Recommended by a member of the House League Services Committee or the Program Coordinator
