

CANpitch – Committee Member – Job Description

Major Objective/Purpose:

To assist the Pitching Chairman in the development and administration of the CANpitch national pitching program. To represent and promote Softball Canada's national pitching program, CANpitch, and its initiatives in the Province of Ontario.

Qualifications:

- a. Must be a member of one of Softball Ontario's Member Associations (ORSA, OASA and PWSA).
- b. Good communication and administrative skills.
- c. A willingness to do tasks as assigned by Chairperson.
- d. Must sign Softball Ontario's Confidentiality Agreement.
- f. Must Complete a Softball Ontario Volunteer Application.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- a. Have knowledge of and support Softball Ontario, the CANpitch program and softball in general.
- b. Assist Program Coordinator in preparing information packages and reports by providing suggestions or feedback.
- c. Attend all Pitching Committee Meetings.
- d. Responsible for decisions focusing on the delivery and implementation of the CANpitch Program in Ontario.
- e. Commit to assisting in the implementation of Softball Canada's CANpitch Program.
- f. Assist in selection of Regional Pitching Instructors in conjunction with Master Pitching Instructor(s) and Softball Ontario
- g. Assist in writing an annual report for Softball Canada providing data about the program and summarizing the feedback from players, coaches, Master Pitching Instructor(s), Regional Pitching Instructor(s) regarding the CANpitch program.
- h. Attend and provide feedback at two CANpitch Committee meetings per year at the least

Commitment/Duration of the Job:

The position of committee member usually covers a period of two years as appointed by their Member Association with no maximum number of terms.

The OASA position will come due with the Chairman position on odd-years and PWSA/ORSA Committee positions will come due on even-year.

The Master Pitching Instructor covers a period of three years as appointed by their respective Member Association and Softball Canada and will come due every three-years (starting Fall 2012).

Supervisor:

The Committee Members are responsible to the Pitching Committee Chairperson and the Softball Ontario Board of Directors.
